

PREACHERS' PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION COMMITTEE REPORT

We, your Committee on Preacher's Protective Association, submit the following for your adoption:

I PREACHERS' PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION

The following information has been taken from the Preachers' Protective Association By-laws, which were written and established on April 7, 1964, and updated in the 2002 Quadrennial Conference.

A. PURPOSE

To provide some limited assistance to widows, widowers and families of eligible deceased members.

B. BENEFITS

Benefit amount shall be \$ 3,000.00.

C. ELIGIBLE MEMBERS

- 1. Licensed and/or Ordained Ministers in the South Carolina Conference of the International Pentecostal Holiness Church, Inc. with ten (10) years of service, and Local Church Ministers who have pastored at least ten (10) years accumulatively.**
- 2. A minister (member) who transfers, withdraws or is dismissed from the South Carolina Conference for any reason shall at the time of his or her withdrawal, transfer or dismissal, lose eligibility for benefits. Further, a member who is not in full benefit (in non-compliance with tithe and other requirements) or who has transferred, withdrawn or been dismissed from the Conference, shall have and his or her beneficiary, no interest, financial, equitable or otherwise in the Preachers' Protective Association and shall not be entitled to any payment thereof unless he/she has been restored to full benefit by current or retroactive action of the majority of the Conference Executive Council of the South Carolina Conference of the International Pentecostal Holiness Church, Inc.**

D. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Cooperative relationship with Conference in executing assignments and duties.**
- 2. Pay tithe of his/her income both secular and ministerial, into the Conference treasury.**
- 3. Comply with all other provisions set forth in the MANUAL of the International Pentecostal Holiness Church.**

E. METHOD OF FUNDING

The Preachers' Protective Association fund shall be supported by a line item of the conference annual budget.

F. GENERAL RULES

- 1. Members must designate a beneficiary on form furnished by the Preachers' Protective Association. Otherwise, payment will be made to the estate of the deceased member.**
- 2. Payment of benefits will be issued to beneficiary. Conference Executive Council may require receipt of due proof of death.**

G. ADMINISTRATIVE

- 1. The Preachers' Protective Association is governed by the Conference Executive Council of the South Carolina Conference, which has full authority in determining facts relevant to membership and eligibility of members to receive benefits. Decision of the Conference Executive Council in such matters shall be final.**
